WHAT is SP&DQ Committee?

SP&DQ stands for "Surveillance Practice and Data Quality".

This committee is dedicated to document and coordinate malaria surveillance and data quality strengthening efforts.



WHY established?

This committee was set up following recommendations from the 31st SMERG* meeting [23-25 September 2020].

smerg sp&dQ Committee is established to improve the visibility of surveillance and data quality improvement initiatives and to streamline global coordination of surveillance-related efforts.

WHEN established?

The ToR finalized and published in April 2021.

The first official meeting realized on 6th May 2021.

The committee has 3 years investment till January 2024.

HOW operates?


The committee is led by two "co-leads". At least one of them must be NMCP representative.





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Background

- Assessment was conducted in mid 2019 and disseminated by SMERG Secretariat and Co-Chairs among country programs in Q1 2021
- Objective: To get a better understanding of the malaria surveillance, monitoring and evaluation needs at a country program level
- Participation: 37 respondents from 11
 African countries (36% response rate)



Highest priority challenges


- 1. Conducting data quality audits


